This magnificent 7th century **Odzun church** is situated in the north of Armenia in the village of Odzun (3 hours from Yerevan) built by Catholicos Hovhannes of Odzun. According to a legend, when Hovhannes was at prayer, two dragons fell upon his residence. Hovhannes made the sign of the Cross before them and the two dragons instantly turned into stone. These stone dragons exist today.

The Engineering Lab Establishment in Stepanavan project is aimed at developing IT education environment in Stepanavan and surrounding areas and creating prerequisites for potential employment in IT sector.

Youth Business Armenia project helps young people to start their own business and makes a direct impact on unemployment and the social state of the regions of Armenia. In remote communities of Armenia, 33 small businesses of young entrepreneurs, aged 23 to 36, are empowered to start and grow sustainably.

The **Congregation of the Armenian Sisters** of the Immaculate Conception is a religious order of nuns established in 1847 in Constantinople for the purpose of educating the Armenian youth.

The Civic Dialogue and Action for Change project encourages university students to become active citizens in their communities by empowering them to identify problems and implement creative solutions.

Sevanavank is a monastic complex located on a peninsula at the northwestern shore of Lake Sevan in the Gegharkunik Province of Armenia, not far from the town of Sevan. According to an inscription in one of the churches, the monastery of Sevanavank was founded in 874 AD by Princess Mariam, the daughter of Ashot I (who became a king a decade later).

The Youth Engaged in Society project is aimed at fostering democracy and developing civically responsible citizens through the establishment of debate clubs in Armenia. The project began in 2005 and is active in more than 100 schools of Armenian regions.

On the territory of the complex there are several khachkars (cross stones) of original design the most valuable of which is a khachkar by Momik dating to 1308 AD.
